5 Plan For Delays

- Exports: Make sure all critical shipments arrive at the port by January 13, anticipated to be the last full day for container pickup and drop-off.
- Imports: Stay in touch with your Steamship Line (SSL) or Freight Forwarder (FF) to understand potential delays.

Prepare For Increased Costs

Be prepared for temporary price increases caused by strained capacity and potential demurrage charges. Proactive planning can help you avoid last-minute scrambles and unexpected expenses.
